The Department of Pathology in conjunction with TriCore Reference Laboratories is seeking qualified applicants for a faculty position as Director of the Laboratory Medicine section. Faculty rank and faculty track will be determined according to the qualifications and interest of the candidate. This position will have broad oversight for Laboratory Medicine activities in the Department of Pathology. The current faculty practice at the University Hospital and Clinics and provide services at linked UNM facilities in Albuquerque such as the NCI designated Cancer Center as well as sites outside Albuquerque. Laboratory Medicine pathology services are largely organized within TriCore Reference Laboratories, a non-profit sponsored by UNM and Presbyterian Medical Services. TriCore serves the entire State of New Mexico and national consultation services as well as its two sponsors and is one of the largest clinical laboratories in the U.S.

The UNM Department of Pathology has 65 faculty members and 60 clinical residents and fellows and graduate students and postdoctoral fellows. TriCore employs 1,000. The UNM Health Sciences Center and TriCore Reference Laboratories both have rapidly expanding clinical services. The Department's research programs in infectious disease, immunology, cancer biology, and translational science have been dramatically broadened recently with the addition or expansion of several new NIH funded programs: Spatiotemporal Modeling Center, The New Mexico Center for Molecular Discovery and the UNM Interdisciplinary HPV Prevention Center.

Minimum Requirements: Candidates must hold an MD or MD/PhD or equivalent degree, be board certified/eligible as a Clinical Pathologist, have a scholarly record appropriate for a faculty appointment, and clinical expertise relevant for appointment in the School of Medicine. The candidate should be eligible for licensure in the State of New Mexico, and must be eligible to work in the United States.

Desired Qualifications: A record of achievement and leadership at a senior rank in the clinical laboratory. A substantial record of scholarly achievement related to medicine. Experience and skills in leadership and in faculty professional development. A working knowledge of laboratory medicine in both the academic health center and the reference laboratory settings.

Salary: Rank and salary will be commensurate with experience and education.

Application Process: For best consideration, applications must be received by August 31, 2010; however, the position will remain open until filled.

A complete application must include a letter of interest addressing each minimum and preferred qualification, relating personal qualifications to the responsibilities of the position; CV; and the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of three references.

Candidates will be consulted before references are contacted.

This position may be subject to a criminal record screening in accordance with New Mexico law. If a criminal record screening is mandated, clearance by the New Mexico Department of Health is required as a condition of employment.
