The Department of Pathology at the University of Pittsburgh is seeking an additional Assistant/Associate Professor (tenure stream or nontenure depending on qualifications and extent of research effort) for the Division of Hematopathology in the Section of Laboratory Medicine. The candidate must have an M.D. with appropriate board certification/eligibility/training; experience in a large hospital-based service is beneficial as is board certification in hematopathology. The successful candidate for this position will provide leadership in the clinical application of newer molecular technologies and investigations in diagnostic hematopathology, and provide some service in this area. Participation in other divisional clinical activities is also possible.

Candidates who have or can develop an externally-funded translational or basic research program are highly preferred. The Department will provide generous funds for transition or establishment of the research program. Involvement in divisional teaching activities is expected. The eight member hematopathology division has a strong interest in hematopathology service, research and education and serves the entire UPMC-Health System. Academic rank, tenure and salary will be commensurate with experience. Eligibility for medical licensure or practice in Pennsylvania is required.
