The University of Chicago Department of Pathology offers a one- or two-year fellowship in Transplantation Immunobiology starting July 1st 2011 in the laboratory of Susana R. Marino, M.D., Ph.D, D (ABHI). Incumbents for this fellowship position would be involved with training and research in Transplantation Immunobiology (TI) and Immunogenetics (TII) for one (1) year, not to exceed two (2) years. The Transplant Immunology and Immunogenetics Laboratory (TIIL) reviews over 500 full range adult and pediatric solid organ and stem cell transplant, blood bank and HLA associated disease cases. Under the direct supervision of the Transplant Immunology Program Director and attending faculty, the Fellow will participate in the review of reports and consultation cases. Performs research in collaboration with the Principal Investigator, research scientists, and laboratory personnel.

Essential Functions

60% - RESEARCH: Participates in and manages research project studying Transplantation Immunobiology (TI) and Immunogenetics (TII). Engages in translational and basic science research, present findings at national meetings, and publish work in appropriate journals.

30% - CLINICAL: Analyzes in-house and external TI reports and consultation cases; Collaborates with clinical transplant programs and others, including weekly clinical Pathology conferences to discuss interesting and difficult cases.

10% - TEACHING: Coordinates residents and fellows rotations. Prepare and present cases and findings at several departmental and multidisciplinary conferences.

Requirements

A minimum of three years' training in clinical pathology or four years training that combines anatomic and clinical pathology. The candidate must be able to obtain an Illinois medical license.

Stipend

Commensurate with level of training.
