

## YALE TRANSFUSION MEDICINE PHYSICIAN-SCIENTIST TRAINING

The Transfusion Medicine Physician Scientist Training Program at Yale University offers combined clinical and research training in the discipline with the goal of producing basic, translational, and clinical research physician-scientists in the field. The fellowship is a three year program with the first year including clinical training that will qualify the trainee to take Boards in Transfusion Medicine and which includes initiation of the research project; the second year includes 20% longitudinal clinical training and 80% research, and the third year may include up to 100% research. Clinical training is done at Yale-New Haven Hospital (YNHH), the American Red Cross (ARC) Connecticut Region, and the VA Connecticut Healthcare System. Research mentors include faculty from many Yale Medical School Departments, including Immunobiology, Genetics, Biomedical Engineering, the Stem Cell Institute, Pathology, Cell Biology, and the Cancer Center as well as Laboratory Medicine Department faculty. There is the opportunity, as part of the program, to obtain a Master's in Health Sciences or a PhD in Investigative Medicine (the latter with commitment of at least one more year). Candidates should be Board-eligible or Board-certified in Clinical Pathology or another major relevant specialty board such as Anesthesiology, Medicine or Pediatrics. Stipends are commensurate with the year of postgraduate training. Applicants must satisfy the qualifications for an NIH National Research Service Award. Applications for July, 2013 must be received by September 1, 2012; however, early completion is encouraged.
