



Clinical Chemist/Clinical Pathologist for Endocrine Testing University of Utah

The Department of Pathology at the University of Utah has a new faculty position available and is seeking a clinical chemist or a clinical pathologist with expertise in endocrinology to serve as a director of Endocrinology at ARUP Laboratories, Inc. This faculty member will be part of a team that directs qualitative and quantitative analyses of endocrine analytes including steroid hormones, peptide and protein hormones, and autoantibodies, as well as associated research and development efforts conducted at ARUP Laboratories. Primary technologies currently employed include automated immunoassay, ELISA, RIA, IRMA, HPLC, and LC-MS/MS. Testing supports many clinical applications including provocative tests, endocrine neoplasia detection and monitoring, and pediatric testing. The successful applicant will have expertise in assay development and validation, clinical interpretation of laboratory results, consultation with physicians, resident and fellow education, experience in quality control and quality assurance, and a proven publication history. Experience conducting clinical/applied research is highly desirable. Individuals eligible for the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor are preferred. Applicants with a PhD should be board certified or eligible by ABCC. Clinical pathologist applicants should be board certified or qualified in clinical pathology by ABP.
