The Department of Pathology at the University of Utah has a new faculty position available and is seeking a PH.D. toxicologist or clinical chemist, or a clinical pathologist with expertise in therapeutic monitoring and toxicology, to serve as a Director of Toxicology at ARUP Laboratories, Inc. This faculty member will be part of a team that directs qualitative and quantitative analyses of therapeutic drugs, drugs of abuse, and several toxicants such as heavy metals and ethylene glycol, as well as associated research and development efforts. Primary technologies currently employed include immunoassay, HPLC, GC-MS, LC-MS/MS, TOF LC-MS and ICP-MS. Specimen types include urine, blood, tissue, and meconium. Testing supports clinical applications including compliance testing for pain management clinics, detection of in utero drug exposure, occupational monitoring, decontamination monitoring, therapeutic drug monitoring, and other aspects of patient care. The successful applicant will have expertise in assay development and validation, clinical interpretation of laboratory results, consultation with physicians, resident and fellow education, experience in quality control and quality assurance, and a proven publication history. Experience conducting pharmacokinetic analyses and participating in clinical research is highly desirable. Individuals eligible for the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor are preferred. Applicants with a Ph.D. should be board certified or eligible by ABCC or ABFT. Clinical pathologist applicants should be board certified or qualified in clinical pathology by ABP.
