

## **Faculty Position in Pathology at the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center and the University of Washington**

The Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center (FHCRC), an internationally renowned center of excellence for hemopoietic stem cell transplantation (HSCT), basic research in cancer cell biology, and treatment of various cancers, and the University of Washington Department of Pathology are recruiting a full-time faculty member. The appointment at the FHCRC will be as an Assistant, Associate or Full Member with a non-tenured faculty appointment as Assistant, Associate or Full Professor in the Department of Pathology. The candidate must be an M.D. who is board-certified in Anatomic Pathology.

The pathologist will join the Pathology Department located at the Seattle Cancer Care Alliance (SCCA) on the FHCRC campus. The FHCRC/SCCA performs  $\geq 500$  HSCT/year. A major responsibility is to provide pathology support for the HSCT service focused on hematolymphoid, gastrointestinal/hepatic, pulmonary, skin, and infectious disease pathology. The SCCA and FHCRC campus affords considerable opportunities for collaborative research with the very robust programs dealing with diseases treated by HSCT, other types of cancer, as well as for independent projects.

Interested candidates should submit a *curriculum vitae*, three (3) reference letters, and a concise description of their training, research activities and career goals.
